Website Developments—Watch the Santa Teresa DVD



Contemplate the Face of Christ is an initiative of the Year of Grace National Planning Team seeking to help Australians spend some time 'contemplating his face'.

The DVD consists of 32 images sourced from Australia in a variety of forms – paintings, drawings, icons, Indigenous images, stained glass, statues, etc. Each image is on the screen for about 50 seconds, accompanied by a quiet, meditative soundtrack. 
Catering Team — absolutely delicious

Prayer Resource




Prayer is often perceived as a difficult 'place-less' exercise. Prayer can have its own sense of place – landscapes which we can inhabit and explore, and meet God as tangibly as we might a fellow traveller.

In this beautifully illustrated book, Margaret Silf explores nine landscapes of prayer, both classic and modern: the garden, the mountain, the seashore, the forest, the river, the urban jungle, the desert, the cave, and the night sky. All are fruitful areas for self-discovery, inviting us to connect with the mystery of God in our lives. Margaret Silf is a prolific writer and retreat leader in the Ignatian tradition. Her books are available at Christian bookstores and online. Margaret has visited Santa Teresa several times.

Weathering the Storm

In 2012, over 2,800 people visited Santa Teresa, some in groups, others as individuals, some for a day of spiritual formation, others stayed overnight with the bravest completing the 30 day Ignatian retreat. Already in the first two months of 2013, we have welcomed 525 visitors, the majority of whom were teachers attending spirit filled in-service seminars.

The storms in late January resulted in damage to the roof of Lisieux Place and debris spread across the grounds. Thanks to the efforts of our cleaning and grounds teams, the Centre was quickly back in top shape.
