## Couderc Cottage Formation Space




With its idyllic views across Moreton Bay across to Stradbroke Island, the Cottage is another popular formation space for groups of 10-20 people. Newly installed audio visual equipment ensures that groups have access to modern technology for formation needs. The kitchen, new chairs and immediate access to the grounds makes this a versatile space that accommodates a wide range of activities.

Named after the founder (St Therese Couderc canonised in 1970) of the Cenacle Sisters who built and ran the Centre from 1980-2006, the cottage was their residence. Currently, it provides accommodation for the overnight caretakers and visitors in the 3 bedrooms as well as a comfortable formation/lounge area.

# Donations for Future Projects

Great efforts have been expended in enhancing the natural beauty of the setting through major landscape works to create such beautiful prayer spaces as the labyrinth, Quandamooka prayer pathway, Cana (Mary) space and the Hermitage area (pictured right) and prayer fence as well as cultivating the entrance, chapel and hillside gardens and the swales at the front and rear of the property.





# Improvements: Watering System



A fully automated sprinkler system was installed in December to ensure that our beautiful gardens and plants have adequate water during the hot summer months. Drawing on our underground water supplies, the irrigation system has 6 different sprinkler sections covering most of the gardens. It is activated in the early hours of the morning to maximise effectiveness of this watering by avoiding evaporation during the hotter periods of the day. An inbuilt sensor element shuts down the system during rainy periods to conserve our precious water supplies.

The Centre seeks to be a place of great natural beauty by creating and maintaining gardens that show forth the splendour of creation ablaze with the glory of God.

## 2017 Fees – no increases

Despite ongoing cost pressures, particularly increased staffing, 2017 prices have not changed. This means that overnight accommodation and all meals remain at \$150 per person per day and the day visitor costs are \$40 (package 1) and \$50 (package2) respectively.
