7 Pilgrim Days (9 March, 13 March, 19 April, 21 May, 8 June, 9 August, 22 October) have been set for Catholics from across the Archdiocese to come and spend a day at Santa Teresa from 9.30am-3.30pm. This will include times for prayer, input, walks in the grounds, a visit to the Carmelite chapel and the opportunity for the Sacrament of Penance. A simple boxed lunch will be provided free. Each person will receive a pilgrim guidebook with suggestions for practical ways to live a pilgrim life of mercy.

Each of the pilgrim days is limited to 60 people, so bookings are essential, at least 7 days prior to your chosen pilgrim day. New Kitchen

After many years in the planning, our new kitchen is now a reality. The existing working space has been redesigned to create a series of new work areas including a separate wash room with a commercial dishwasher, new stainless benches with heat lamps for food preparation and plating, and two large walk-in fridges that accommodate bulk food supplies plus specialist commercial catering equipment such as two new combo steam ovens and a food processor.

This reorientation of the kitchen means that the catering team no longer enjoy window views across the Moreton Bay, but they have a purposeful working environment to provide excellent quality meals for our guests. We are deeply grateful to Mary-Clair and her team for utilising a temporary kitchen in the Cottage and the challenge of catering amidst building works. Special thanks goes to David Friend from Archdiocesan Building Services, who did a superb job of supervising this major renovation project. Funding for this vital project was through the Archdiocese's capital works program and demonstrates the importance work of Santa Teresa within its life and mission.

Moongalba now a cool space for enjoying bay views

Now that Moongalba has been air-conditioned, this cool space can operate as a separate dining space; an overflow for large groups from the Cenacle dining room; a verandah space for a quiet coffee or another working formation space around tables.

Moongalba (aboriginal for 'sitting down place') with its glass walls provides the perfect spot for soaking in the beauty of the waters of Moreton Bay with the horizon of North Stradbroke Island while eating, relaxing, reading or sharing with others. This name was chosen by the Quandamooka elders as it captures the spirit of the conversations that flowed when the three Passionist priests met the local people on the shores of Straddie in 1843.



St Joseph's accommodation wing



Naming the largest of our accommodation wings after St Joseph, harks back to the origins of the land on which the Centre is built. Ormiston House (pictured) and 27 acres of land was purchased by the Carmelite Sisters in 1965 when they moved from Auchenflower. The land on which Santa Teresa has been built was called St Joseph's fields by the Sisters. It was used for the cultivation of passionfruit. The Cenacle Sisters purchased 1.7 hectares and established the Cenacle retreat centre, which was opened and blessed by Archbishop Francis Rush in 1984.

This wing contains 12 bedrooms each with an ensuite, the laundry and some linen storage. Each room is well equipped and provides a haven for guests to relax, prayer, rest and reflect. Our prayer is that St Joseph will protect each and every visitor and staff member on their spiritual journey, just as he cared for Jesus and Mary.

Vale Sr Pat Clouston

Sr Pat was the Coordinator of the Cenacle Retreat Centre (now Santa Teresa) from its opening in 1984 until its closure in 2004. Sr Pat and Fr John Reilly sj ran countless retreats over this 20 year period. She also attended to the many tasks needed to maintain and develop the Centre. Sr Pat was a member of the Cenacle Sisters, a religious order whose mission is:

*We companion people on their faith journey in the midst of life.
Living justice and Gospel values, we draw from our experience of God,
creating a place where people can encounter God.*

We are deeply grateful for her retreat ministry within the Archdiocese which touched the lives of thousands of people as she lived out the charism of her order's founder, St Therese Couderc. May she now enjoy the peace and love of God's loving embrace.

Record number of visitors in 2015



What an amazing year we had in 2015! There was a record 4088 guests at the Centre with 2,101 day visitors and 1,987 people staying overnight. This was an increase of 755 extra guests (23% growth). August was our busiest month ever with 589 people.

Our STSC team of supervisors, admin support, caterers, cleaners and grounds staff are to be commended for their hard work and wonderful hospitality that creates such a welcoming place to encounter God.
