Spiritual Direction— a source of wisdom for the journey

Spiritual Direction is a facilitation of and reflection on your prayer life in order to deepen your relationship with God.

The spiritual director assists you to talk about what happens when you pray. Because our life and prayer are bound together, life issues would be discussed, but always in the context of prayer that has taken, or will take place. The spiritual director helps you notice how God communicates with you and how God's personal Presence is shown in your life. You are guided to consider how you would like to respond to that personal Presence. Santa Teresa can help you make contact with a spiritual director.



Ongoing Relationship with Santa Teresa Community in Alice Springs



The relationship forged between STSC and the Santa Teresa community outside Alice Springs by Archbishop Bathurst has continued to grow through the sale of indigenous crosses and scarves over the past 9 years. 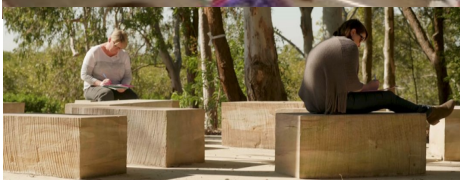


Here are some different ways to pray when staying at Santa Teresa?
